85%-89% of re-arrested offenders are unemployed at the time of arrest.

Risk Factor | Unemployment

The **unemployment rate** of returned offenders is **5X** that of the general population.

Solution | Workforce Development

A successful solution to the lower recidivism must empower offenders to **OBTAIN** and **RETAIN** a position in the workforce. Overwhelming evidence that the response should be twofold:

- 1. Education, technical training, soft skills
- 2. Placement

One study found that talent managers actively seek soft and hard skills and build searches around these factors. Workforce development programs must build toward competitive applicant candidacy.

Studies show that with vocational training, recidivism drops to approx.
